RE: SPaRC Outstanding Service Award

Lisa Young is an outstanding member of the Prairie Research Institute Pre-Post Award Grants team and, we believe, is deserving of the SPaRC Outstanding Service Award. Lisa began her career working at the Illinois State Geological Survey (ISGS) in 2006 as a Grants and Contracts Specialist. She worked as a liaison between the ISGS Principal Investigators and the Office of Sponsored Programs, submitting proposals and providing grants management.

In 2010 she took a position as a Grants and Contracts Coordinator at the campus Grants and Contracts office. By accepting this position, Lisa took on sponsored research project management in a different role, advancing her knowledge of university policy and federal guidelines. She became a liaison between the departmental staff and the sponsor, reviewing awards, processing amendments and modifications, completing transaction audits and approvals, preparing sponsor invoices, and completing award closeouts.

In January of 2012, Lisa returned to the Institute as the Grants and Contracts Coordinator at the Illinois State Water Survey (ISWS). Obviously, her reputation as a knowledgeable and proficient research administrator carried forward from her previous positions, and Lisa was, and still is, well respected by the ISWS staff. She is extremely productive: from 2012-2015 ISWS annual grant expenditures totaled approximately \$8.6M per year, and Lisa submitted 73 proposals/pre-proposals in 2016 and was responsible for the management of 66 active grants in FY17. As shown by the additional letters of support, the ISWS staff appreciate all of the time and effort that she devotes to reviewing and submitting proposals and her skillful approach to grants management. In addition, in FY17, Lisa developed and delivered several well-attended PI information training sessions.



Lisa's impact is not limited to just one Survey: during the FY17 SPaRC'Ed Certification Series, she not only was a participant but was selected as a SPaRC'Ed Instructor, teaching courses on Proposal Preparation and Advanced Proposal Preparation. Lisa received her Illinois Certified Research Administration designation upon her course completion this past spring.

Last year the Prairie Research Institute initiated the reorganization of Research Administration at the Institute, including the Pre-Post Award Grants section. Lisa is a valuable asset to our Pre-Post Award team. Her knowledge of grants management and university policy and procedures is impressive along with her willingness to help others. Lisa has embraced the challenges that come with reorganization and has taken the necessary steps to learn something new and apply that knowledge to assist with the training process. Her contributions to the team have been instrumental in our reorganization efforts.

For the exemplary effort that Lisa exhibits each day and the numerous contributions that she has made to the State Surveys, Prairie Research Institute, and to the campus, it is our pleasure to nominate her for the SPaRC Outstanding Service Award.

Lisa Young and I have worked together since January 2012, over 5 years, at the Illinois State Water Survey (ISWS). I was on the search committee that recommended offering her the position. I have been with the ISWs since 1984 and currently am the Head of the Coordinated Hazard Assessment and Mapping Program (CHAMP) Section. The CHAMP Section typically has 5 to more than 10 active grants totaling over \$2 million. We have grants from multiple federal, state, and local agencies. One of Lisa's many duties is oversight of CHAMP grants from helping to create the budgets to close out.

Lisa reviews and interprets requests for proposals and identifies budget requirements. Lisa has excellent relations with staff at the Office of Sponsored Programs, she tracks proposal progress to make certain that proposals are submitted on time. During a project she provides oversight of expenditures and in particular she has expertise with the latest federal super circular.
