It is my pleasure to nominate Ms. Torie Strole for the SPaRC Outstanding Service Award. Torie started working at the Illinois State Geological Survey (ISGS) in 1994 and has made significant impacts on the functionality of the ISGS Grants and Contracts office ever since where she is the senior staff member. By way of example of the magnitude of impact Torie's work represents, her office has been responsible for submitting more than 150 proposals since 2010, 68 of which have been awarded for more than \$61 million. She has also managed an extremely large US Department of Energy grant through three major research phases through the entire preaward and post-award stages representing research funding of \$100 million since 2003.

Torie is instrumental in the submittal process for new grants. She helps build budgets, educates staff on contracting procedures, and serves as an interface between staff and the University. Torie also works with staff on the post-award management of grants and contracts. In this role, she maintains much of the institutional knowledge necessary for grant management. She also works with staff to ensure that proper spending and accounting are undertaken.

Torie is dedicated to the University and always manages her time to ensure that her responsibilities are covered. In fact, Torie's experience is often shared with the University community through presentations and collaborations with co-workers. She recently completed the SPaRC certification training this past year and is a Certified Research Administrator. Her experience is highly valued as demonstrated by the request for Torie to present to the SPaRC program on the work that she does. Additionally, she has served on University improvement committees.

In summary, Torie has made contributions to the research community of the ISGS and University span more than 20 years. She is dedicated to her job, the ISGS mission, and the overall good of the University.
